



# OSAC - Bringing the Arts to You

In 2022/23, the School Touring Program presented in-person presentations involving the following disciplines: Bollywood Dance, Dance featuring a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Component, World Music and Theatre. The total audience numbers were approximately 19,329 students and teachers. There were four tours, involving 54 schools and travelling to 43 communities throughout the province. Lead teachers in each school contributed approximately 76 non-classroom hours to coordinate these presentations.

Each year, Saskatchewan students, many of whom live in rural areas, enjoy music, dance, drumming, mime, theatre, magic, storytelling, and circus arts performances. Each fall and spring, professional performing artists from Saskatchewan, Canada and beyond, are selected by a jury of teachers and arts educators for their artistic excellence and special ability to interact with and relate to student audiences. Study guides, with suggestions for pre- and post-concert discussion and activities, are sent to schools before each tour. Block booking helps to lower the fee/performance because travel expenses are amortized over two or three weeks. School centres pay a \$30 annual associate member fee when they book, and a \$10 fee is added to the price of each presentation.

OSAC celebrated 50 years as an organization in 2018 and has nurtured the traditions of presenting excellence in the performing arts for adults, children and family audiences in various genres and disciplines. OSAC annually presents over 300 live community and school performances, attended by a total audience of approximately 75,000. This is possible because of a dedicated network of volunteers committed to making culture an integral part of Saskatchewan community life, and vital funding from Saskatchewan Lotteries, SaskCulture Inc. and Canadian Heritage. Saskatchewan Lotteries benefits more than 12,000 sport, culture, and recreation organizations around the province. Each year 600,000 people participate in programs and from activities initiated by these organizations, over \$1 billion of economic activity is generated, and 23,000 jobs are sustained.

# Kung Jaadee: Haida Stories <u>or</u> Squamish Stories (BC) (K-12 audiences), Touring October 1-11, 15-18

Kung Jaadee - Arts IQ

Kung Jaadee (Roberta Kennedy) is a professional storyteller, educator and published author belonging to the Haida, Musqueam and Squamish First Nations. Her Haida name, Kung Jaadee, means 'Moon Woman' and was presented to her at her great uncle's memorial feast by her cousin Crystal Robinson. Over the past 30 years, Kung Jaadee has performed traditional Haida legends, while also sharing vivid personal stories about her clan's survival of the smallpox epidemic, and the history and culture of her people. She has performed at hundreds of festivals, schools and Aboriginal celebrations across Canada. She is the author of the popular children's books, Feast and Gifts from Raven (selected as a Local BC Book to Read), as well as curriculum textbooks, Haida Nation: Indigenous Communities in Canada and Home. Her stories have also been published in several anthologies, magazines and online publications. While living in Haida Gwaii, she taught Xaad Kil, the Haida language while working with the Old Masset Village Council, at Chief Matthews School and the Haida Health Centre in Gaw Tlagee. Kung Jaadee holds a Bachelor of Arts with a major in English and minor in Women's Studies from the University of Victoria and a Bachelor of Education from the University of Alberta.

**Haida Stories:** In her live storytelling performance, Kung Jaadee shares her telling of a few famous Haida legends about Raven (Yaahl), the creator of the world, and their universal teachings. Enjoy the stories of "Raven Brings the Water," Raven's Brings the Light" and "Raven's Feast." She also shares some traditional Raven songs while using her drum, teaches some basic words in Xaad Kil (Haida language), and shows her traditional regalia. Includes a Q&A to discuss Haida culture, traditions and history.

**Squamish Stories:** In her live storytelling performance, Kung Jaadee will share her telling of Squamish legends popularized by Indigenous activist and poet E. Pauline Johnson's book, "Legends of Vancouver." The legends she'll share may include Siwash Rock; Lost Lagoon; the Two-Headed Sea Serpent; The Two Sisters (The Lions mountains); How the Salmon Came to the Squamish People; The Great Flood Story; and How the Squamish People Came To Be. **A Study Guide will be provided for both the Haida and Squamish Stories**.
